1. **Tables (records):** Tables, which are also called records, store information in columns and rows. Here, you see a simple table (record) with names and business units. You add additional information by adding new rows.
2. **Database:** A database is a collection of information organized in multiple tables so that it can be easily accessed, managed, and updated.
3. **Relational Database:** A relational database is also a collection of data· names and business units, for example· but it is organized as a set of tables from which the data can be accessed or reassembled in different ways.
